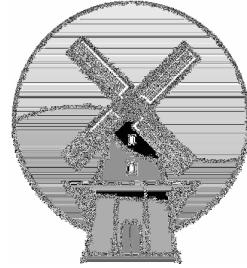

LITTLE CHUTE, WI (January 28, 2009) – Little Chute Windmill, Inc., a non-profit organization dedicated to celebrating the Dutch heritage of northeast Wisconsin, features a variety of resources on Dutch-American heritage and Dutch culture on their website [www.littlechutewindmill.org](http://www.littlechutewindmill.org). A new Dutch Recipe Archive on the website provides free access to a number of traditional recipes. The archive continues to grow and recipe submissions are welcome.
