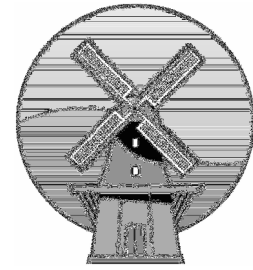

LITTLE CHUTE WINDMILL, INC. DECIDES TO BUILD DOWNTOWN, ORDER WINDMILL

LITTLE CHUTE (October 9, 2008) – Little Chute Windmill, Inc., a non-profit organization dedicated to celebrating Dutch heritage by building an authentic Dutch windmill and visitor center, has decided to build the Windmill Project at their original location in downtown Little Chute. At a special meeting, the Little Chute Windmill, Inc. board of directors discussed concerns over delays in the Windmill Project and increased costs associated with building on Island Park on the Fox River.

The board of directors stated in the meeting that delays in securing funding for the replacement of the Mill Street lift bridge to Island Park was in turn delaying construction of the Windmill Project. Additionally, it was stated there is no guarantee the funding for the lift bridge would be available in the future, especially given the current economic climate. Another concern mentioned was the increased costs associated with building the Little Chute Windmill and Van Asten Visitor Center on Island Park, which had become apparent during the planning phase. The cost of the lift bridge was also mentioned. "The Windmill board was very concerned about delays and also the cost of the design and construction of the Mill Street Bridge," said board president Donald De Groot. "We feel comfortable with the downtown location and the fact that we won't be using tax dollars for our project." Ultimately, the board of directors agreed the project was being placed in jeopardy and voted unanimously to build on their property in downtown Little Chute. While fundraising is not yet complete, the board of directors felt comfortable with its progress and decided to order the windmill from their builder in the Netherlands as soon as possible.

"The board agrees it is important to get going with the project and ensure it's completion and future success," said Little Chute Windmill executive director Robin Dekker. "The decision to build downtown is the best thing for the Windmill Project, and I think, the best thing for the community at this point. We are now able to order the windmill and begin construction in the spring, which is very exciting." A timetable for construction will be set forth in the coming weeks, as well as a date when the windmill will be officially ordered.

Little Chute Windmill, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization dedicated to raising \$2.5 million to build an authentic 100 foot tall Dutch windmill in Little Chute to celebrate the Dutch heritage of northeast Wisconsin. To date, approximately \$2.1 million towards the goal has been raised.
