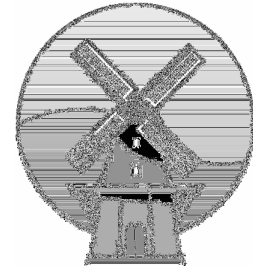

LITTLE CHUTE WINDMILL TO BE ORDERED DECEMBER 8

LITTLE CHUTE, WI (November 25, 2008) – Little Chute Windmill, Inc., a nonprofit organization dedicated to celebrating Dutch heritage by building an authentic Dutch windmill and visitor center in downtown Little Chute, WI, will order the windmill from their Dutch builder on Monday, December 8. Lukas Verbij of Verbij Windmill Design and Construction will visit Little Chute to finalize the contract for purchase of the 100-foot tall functioning windmill, and a signing ceremony will be held at 4:00 p.m. at the Little Chute Elementary School cafeteria, 901 Grand Avenue in Little Chute. Community members and supporters are invited to attend.

Little Chute Windmill, Inc. was incorporated as a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization in 2002, when it officially began raising funds for the grain-grinding windmill and attached visitor center museum. Since that time, approximately \$2.1 million has been raised towards the capital campaign goal of \$2.5 million. “We are close enough to our goal to feel comfortable ordering the windmill, but we are still seeking support to help us wrap up the tail end of our fundraising,” said Windmill Director Robin Dekker. “It is very exciting to know that after December 8, our windmill will be under construction and on its way. The Windmill Project is going to do great things for the community and the region.”

Construction of the Van Asten Visitor Center will take place in 2009, while the windmill is being constructed in the Netherlands. The windmill will be disassembled and shipped to Little Chute in five sea containers, in time for reassembly by Verbij and his team early in the spring of 2010. The Little Chute Windmill & Van Asten Visitor Center will be open to the public later in the spring of 2010. A more specific timetable will be set forth in the coming months as planning continues.

Little Chute Windmill, Inc. is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization dedicated to raising \$2.5 million to build an authentic 100-foot tall Dutch windmill and visitor center in Little Chute, WI to celebrate the Dutch heritage of northeast Wisconsin. To date, approximately \$2.1 million towards the goal has been raised. Visitors will be able to tour the different levels of the windmill and watch volunteer millers demonstrate the centuries-old process of turning grain into flour by harnessing wind power. The Van Asten Visitor Center will feature exhibits on the legacy of Dutch settlement in the region and the state.
